Alcohol

In the early 1940s a Naval Academy company officer found an empty whiskey bottle hidden in a midshipman room, 37-39
Serving of unauthorized wine to Naval Academy midshipmen in 1943, 38
In World War II crew members of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) drank torpedo alcohol, 51-52
Beer for the crew of the *Barton* in 1945 after a long session of loading ammunition, 58-59
Rum ration served to crew members of British warships in the early 1950s, 93-94
In the mid-1950s Admiral Felix Stump objected to staff members bringing alcohol to Hawaii, 113

Alexander, Lieutenant William H. II, USN (USNA, 1944)

Flight training in the late 1940s, 70
Service in the early 1950s in squadron VC-33, 74-76

Ammunition

Use of proximity fuzes on 5-inch projectiles fired by the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in 1944-45, 44, 60
Explosion of a white phosphorus 5-inch projectile on board the *Barton* in March 1945, 54-55
Replenishment of ammunition for the *Barton* at Kerama Retto in 1945, 58
Handling of in the mid-1960s by the crew of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6), 158-163, 166-167, 169-170
Off-loading of ammunition from the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969, 183-185

Anderson, Admiral George W., Jr., USN (Ret.) (USNA, 1927)

In the mid-1950s was Deputy CinCPac, 115

Former Chief of Naval Operations who took care of funeral arrangements when Admiral Felix Stump died in 1972, 110

Antiair Warfare

The destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) fired her 5-inch guns against Japanese aircraft in 1944-45, 48-49, 51, 60

Army, U.S.

Some of General Douglas MacArthur's staff members rode the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in World War II, 49

Atlantic Fleet

Admiral Isaac C. Kidd, Jr., served as fleet commander in chief, 1975-78, 223-235

Attack Squadron 15 (VA-15)

Operations in the Atlantic and Mediterranean in the late 1950s, 118-126

Attack Squadron 176 (VA-176)

Operations in the Atlantic and Mediterranean in the early 1960s, 133-141

On alert during the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962, 134

Australia

In the mid-1950s Admiral Felix Stump, CinCPac, visited Australia to commemorate the World War II Battle of the Coral Sea, 114

Bagley, Vice Admiral David H., USN (USNA, 1944)

Served as Chief of Naval Personnel in the early 1970s, 213-214

Bagley, Vice Admiral Worth H., USN (USNA, 1947)

Served as the Navy Director of Program Planning in the early 1970s, 213

Barnes, Midshipman Willis C., USN (USNA, 1945)

Served as a company commander at the Naval Academy in the early 1940s, 42

***Barton*, USS (DD-722)**

Damaged during the D-Day operation at Normandy in June 1944, 45

In 1944 Marian Forbes visited the ship at Boston, 26-27, 61

Quality officers on board in 1944-45, 45-46, 48

World War II combat duty in the Western Pacific, 1944-45, 47-55, 58-60

Enlisted crew members during World War II, 51-52, 54-55

Collision with the destroyer *Ingraham* (DD-694) on the night of 16 February 1945, 52-54

Explosion of a white phosphorus 5-inch projectile in March 1945, 54-55

Postwar service in 1945-46, 60-64

Transport of atomic bomb components to Bikini Atoll in 1946, 63-65
Decommissioning in January 1947, 66 Was sunk as a target ship in 1969, 142

Becker, Midshipman Merlin D., USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941 -44, 28-29, 37

Bessac, Commander Norman B., USN (Ret.) (USNA, 1945)

Nicknamed “Buzz” as a Naval Academy midshipman in the early 1940s, 37, 39
In the early 1960s served with Admiral Hyman Rickover in the nuclear power program, 139-140, 178-179
Retired in 1965 to seek civilian employment, 178-179

Bikini Atoll, Marshall Islands

Site of atomic bomb tests in 1946, 63-65

Bombs/Bombing

Atomic bomb tests at Bikini Atoll in 1946, 63-65
The AD/A-1 Skyraider was used for training for nuclear weapons delivery missions in the late 1950s-early 1960s, 80, 120-122, 181

Bonds, Midshipman Joseph E., USN (USNA, 1945)

At Naval Academy Prep School in 1941, 13-14
As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941-44, 37

Boorda, Admiral Jeremy M., USN

Served 1988-91 as Chief of Naval Personnel and 1991-94 as CinCSouth, 129-130

Boston Navy Yard

Repaired the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) after battle damage in 1944, 26-27, 45

Brown, Midshipman John Wilson IV, USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941-44, 9-10

Bureau of Naval Personnel

Detailing of officers to various billets in the late 1960s, 173, 177-178, 180
Detailing of officers to various billets in the early 1970s, 206-215

Burke, Rear Admiral Arleigh A., USN (USNA, 1923)

As CNO designate in 1955 visited Admiral Felix Stump in Hawaii, 108-109

Carrier Group Six

Operations in the Atlantic and Mediterranean, 1973-75, 215-221
Staff officers in the early 1970s, 216-217
In 1974 the commanding officer of the aircraft carrier *Saratoga* (CVA-60) was relieved for cause, 219-221

Carter, Midshipman Robert Ross, USN (USNA, 1942)

As a Naval Academy midshipman in the early 1940s, 21-23

Chiang Kai-shek

As President of Nationalist China in the mid-1950s, conferred with Admiral Felix Stump through Madame Chiang, 102-104

Colbus, Commander Louis, USN

Served on the Carrier Group Six staff in the early 1970s, 216-217

Collisions

The destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) collided with the destroyer *Ingraham* (DD-694) on the night of 16 February 1945, 52-54

Combs, Rear Admiral Walter Vincent, Jr., USN (USNA, 1936)

Headed OP-103, the Manpower Program Branch of the OpNav staff, in the mid- 1960s, 156

Composite Squadron 33 (VC-33)

Operations in 1949-50 centered mostly around antisubmarine warfare and attack against surface ships, 72-74, 79-82

Corpus Christi Naval Air Station, Cabaniss Field, Texas

Site of naval aviation training in the mid-1950s, 97-98

Cuban Missile Crisis

Attack Squadron 176 (VA-176) was on alert during the 1962 crisis, 134

Dement, Captain Donald E., Medical Corps, USN

In the mid-1950s lived near Admiral Felix Stump while stationed in Hawaii, 112

Dexter, Commander Edwin B., USN (USNA, 1928)

Commanded the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) during World War II, 49-50, 67

Disciplinary Problems

Captain's mast on board the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969-70, 191-193

Dunn, Captain Robert F., USN (USNA, 1951)

In 1974 became commanding officer of the aircraft carrier *Saratoga* (CVA-60) when his predecessor was relieved for cause, 219-221

Education

Forbes's education in Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania in the 1920s-30s, 1-8

For Naval Academy midshipmen in the early 1940s, 27-30, 40-41

Forbes received postgraduate education at Stanford University, 1959-60, 126-131

Egypt

In the spring of 1967 the crew of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) photographed Egyptian troops while passing through the Suez Canal, 164

Eisenhower, President Dwight D. (USMA, 1915)

In the mid-1950s conferred with Admiral Felix Stump about U.S. relations with Taiwan, 102-105

Englehart, Midshipman Harry A., Jr., USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941-44, 30-31, 39

Enlisted Personnel

Boot camp training at Norfolk, Virginia, in 1938, 7-8, 11-13

On board the aircraft carrier *Yorktown* (CV-5) in the late 1930s, 8-9, 14-21

In the crew of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) during World War II, 51-52, 54-55

In Attack Squadron 15 (VA-15) in the late 1950s, 125-126

In the crew of the aircraft carrier *Franklin D. Roosevelt* (CVA-42) in the early 1960s, 146-147

In the crew of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in 1966-67, 157-160, 165-168

Newspaper publisher who received hospital treatment in Hawaii in 1945 after being injured when his airplane was shot down, 56-57

Fashbaugh, Lieutenant (junior grade) Howard, USNR

Served in the engineering department of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in World War II, 45, 61-63

Fay, Midshipman Richard C., USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941-44, 9-11, 21, 23-25, 30, 32, 36, 39

Service during World War II in the light cruiser *Philadelphia* (CL-41), 25

Flight Training

In Florida and Texas, 1947-49, 70-72, 78-79

In Texas in the mid-1950s, 97-98

Food

Doughnuts and turkey as morale boosters for the crew of the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969-70, 184-186

Football

Games involving Naval Academy midshipmen in the early 1940s, 42-43

Duty 1955 to 1957 as aide to Admiral Felix Stump, who was Commander in Chief Pacific/Commander in Chief Pacific Fleet, 100-118, 171, 238

Served 1957-59 as executive officer of Attack Squadron 15 (VA-15), 118-126

Postgraduate education at Stanford University, 1959-60, 126-131

In 1960-61 attended the senior course at the Naval War College, 130-133, 178-179

In 1961 -62 commanded Attack Squadron 176 (VA-176), 133-141

Served as air officer of the carrier *Franklin D. Roosevelt* (CVA-42) from 1962 to 1964, 142-149, 171-172

From 1964 to 1966 served in the manpower section, OP-103, on the OpNav staff, 151-156

Commanded the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in 1966-67, 157-170

From 1967 to 1969 was a detailee in the Bureau of Naval Personnel, 173-181

Commanded the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969-70, 181-193, 197-198, 201

Served 1970-72 as chief of staff to Commander Sixth Fleet, 194-206

In 1972-73 was head detailee in the Bureau of Naval Personnel, 206-215

Served in 1975-76 as Deputy Commander in Chief Atlantic/Deputy Commander in Chief Atlantic Fleet, 223-234

Greer, Vice Admiral Howard E., USN (USNA, 1944)

In the early 1960s commanded the air group based on board the carrier *Shangri-La* (CVA-38), 137-138, 141-142

In 1976 filled in temporarily as Deputy CinCLantFlt, 232

Gunnery - Naval

Firing by the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in the Western Pacific in 1944-45, 47-49, 54, 58-59

Halsey, Admiral William F., Jr., USN (USNA, 1904)

In 1945 received medical treatment at hospital in Hawaii, 57

Hamel, Lieutenant Commander James K., USN

Served in the late 1960s-early 1970s as chief engineer of the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62), 188-189

Hawaii

In the mid-1950s the headquarters of CinCPac/CinCPacFlt was near Pearl Harbor, 101, 105-106, 111-112, 115-116

Vice President Richard Nixon visited Admiral Felix Stump in the mid-1950s, 106-108

Holloway, Vice Admiral James L., Jr., USN (USNA, 1919)

Served in the mid-1950s as Chief of Naval Personnel, 88-89, 100, 117, 145

Holloway, Admiral James L. III, USN (USNA, 1943)

Commanded the aircraft carrier *Enterprise* (CVAN-65) during the Vietnam War, 161-163

As CNO in the mid-1970s asked Forbes to head the Hampton Roads Naval Historical Foundation, 235

Independence, USS (CVA-62)

Operations in the Atlantic and Mediterranean in 1969-70, 182-193, 197-198, 201
Enlisted crew members in 1969-70, 183-185, 190-193
Doughnuts and turkey as morale boosters for the crew in 1969-70, 184-186
Propulsion plant sometimes used JP-5 fuel in 1969-70, 188-189

Ingraham, USS (DD-694)

Collided with the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) the night of 16 February 1945, 52-54

Intelligence

In the spring of 1967 the crew of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) photographed Egyptian troops while passing through the Suez Canal, 164

Iowa, USS (BB-61)

Served in the early 1950s as Second Fleet flagship, 91-94

Italy

Pope Pius XII had an audience with Admiral Felix Stump in the mid-1950s, 104-105
In the early 1970s Gaeta was the homeport for the Sixth Fleet flagship, 194-195, 202

Iwo Jima

Gunfire support provided in March 1945 by the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722), 54-55

Japan

Visited by crew members of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) shortly after the end of World War II, 61-62

Japanese Navy

In World War II the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) fired proximity fuzes at Japanese suicide planes, 48-49, 51, 60

John F. Kennedy, USS (CVA-67)

Served as flagship of Carrier Group Six in the early 1970s, 216-217

Kamikazes

In World War II the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) fired proximity fuzes at Japanese suicide planes, 48-49, 51, 60

Kidd, Admiral Isaac C., Jr., USN (USNA, 1942)

Commanded the Sixth Fleet, 1970-71, 194-197, 199-203, 215
Served 1975-78 as Supreme Allied Commander Atlantic/Commander in Chief Atlantic/Commander in Chief Atlantic Fleet, 223-235

Kissling, Lieutenant Paul T., USN

In the early 1950s served as aide to Admiral Felix B. Stump, 74-77

Koch, Midshipman Konrad K., USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman during World War II, deliberately flunked out and joined the Army, 32-33

Korea

Visited by Admiral Felix Stump, CinCPac, in 1955, 171

Larson, Rear Admiral Charles R., USN (USNA, 1958)

In the early 1960s flew an AD as part of Attack Squadron 176 (VA-176), then switched to nuclear submarines, 136-138

Recommended by Forbes as President Nixon's naval aide and later to be Naval Academy superintendent, 138-139

Lederer, Captain William J., Jr., USN (USNA, 1936)

In the early 1950s served as public affairs officer on the staff of Admiral Felix Stump, CinCPac, 113-114

Lindsey, Commander Robin M., USN

In the early 1950s commanded Composite Squadron 33 (VC-33), 81-82

Love, Commander Winifred, USN

Served in the manpower section of OpNav in the mid-1960s, 155

Lovely, Midshipman Eugene, USN (USNA, 1972)

Enlisted crew member of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in the mid-1960s and later graduated from the Naval Academy, 165-166

Lynn, Commander James W., Supply Corps, USN (USNA, 1950)

Served in the late 1960s-early 1970s as supply officer of the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62), 184-186, 190-191

Manpower

Work of OP-103, the Manpower Program Branch of the OpNav staff, in the mid-1960s, 151-156

Marine Corps, U.S.

Learned flying proficiency from Corpus Christi, Texas, instructors in the mid-1950s, 98-99

Marschall, Midshipman Albert R., USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Naval Academy midshipman, 1941-44, 23, 28-30, 32, 34-36

Matthews, Captain Herbert Spencer, Jr., USN

Commanded the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1968-69, 183, 191

McIntire, Commander Harrison P., USN (USNA, 1935)

Commanded the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) during World War II, 49

McNamara, Robert S.

As secretary of Defense in the 1960s was concerned about military manpower, 151-154

Medical Problems

In 1945 Forbes was treated for wounds suffered when a 5-inch projectile exploded, 54-56

In August 1976 Forbes had a heart attack that led to his being retired from active duty, 227-230

Mediterranean Sea

In the early 1960s Attack Squadron 176 (VA-176) was deployed to the Sixth Fleet, 135-136

In the late 1960s-early 1970s the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) deployed to the Sixth Fleet, 186-187

Soviet Navy operations in the Mediterranean in the early 1970s, 197-198, 217

Military Academy, West Point, New York

Football games against the Naval Academy in the early 1940s, 43

Miller, Chief Fire Controlman George, USN

Served in the crew of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) during World War II, later became a physician, 51

Miller, Vice Admiral Gerald E., USN (USNA, 1942)

In 1963-64 commanded the aircraft carrier *Franklin D. Roosevelt* (CVA-42), 143, 148-149

As Commander Sixth Fleet in 1971-73 used an aircraft carrier as flagship, 144-145, 200, 204-205

Montgomery, Lieutenant Commander Robert, USNR

Movie star who served in the crew of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in World War II, 45-46

Moorer, Commander Joseph P., USN (USNA, 1945)

In the early 1960s commanded a fighter squadron based on board the carrier *Shangri-La* (CVA-38), 137-138

Movies

Shown to the crew of the aircraft carrier *Franklin D. Roosevelt* (CVA-42) in the early 1960s, 144, 147

Shown to the crew of the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in the mid-1960s, 161, 209-210

Shown to the crew of the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969-70, 209-210

Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland

Midshipman activities in Bancroft Hall in the early 1940s, 9-11, 21-24, 28-33, 36-40

Nixon, Richard M.

As Vice President, visited Hawaii and Admiral Felix Stump in the mid-1950s, 106-108

In the late 1960s picked Charles Larson to be presidential naval aide, 138

Norfolk, Virginia

Site of Navy recruit training in the late 1930s, 7-8, 11-13 Naval Academy Preparatory School, 1940-41, 9

North Atlantic Treaty Organization

Conducted at-sea exercises in the early 1950s, 91-94

The U.S. Sixth Fleet was involved in NATO exercises in the Mediterranean in the early 1970s, 201-202

Norway

Visited by NATO warships during an exercise in the early 1950s, 94

Nuclear Weapons

Atomic bomb tests at Bikini Atoll in 1946, 63-65

The AD/A-1 Skyraider was used for training for nuclear weapons delivery missions in the late 1950s-early 1960s, 80, 120-122, 181

In the mid-1970s Forbes had to be available for possible release of nuclear weapons, 226, 230-231

Okinawa

In 1945 the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) provided heavy gunfire support for the U.S. invasion of the island, 58-59, 61

PC-572, USS

Operations in the Caribbean in 1947, 67-69

Pay and Allowances

For junior Navy enlisted personnel in the late 1930s-early 1940s, 13

Limited spending money for Naval Academy midshipmen in the early 1940s, 34-36

Pearl Harbor, Hawaii

Reaction at the Naval Academy to the December 1941 Japanese attack, 22-23

Personnel

Work of OP-103, the Manpower Program Branch of the OpNav staff, in the mid-1960s, 151-156

Petersen, Midshipman Christian Charles, USN (USNA, 1945)

As a Navy enlisted man and Naval Academy midshipman, 1938-44, 7, 9

Resigned from the Navy as a lieutenant commander, 7

Philippine Islands

In 1966-67 the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) took on ammo and supplies at Subic Bay, 161, 169-170

Pigott, Lieutenant John T., USNR

Served as gunnery officer of the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) in World War II, 48

Pius XII

Pope who had an audience with Admiral Felix Stump in the mid-1950s, 104-105

Polhemus, Ensign William B., USN (USNA, 1946)

Served in the destroyer *Barton* (DD-722) shortly after World War II, 63-64, 67

Propulsion Plants

On board the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in the mid-1960s, 158-160, 167

On board the aircraft carrier *Independence* (CVA-62) in 1969-70, 188-189

Puerto Rico

Base of operations for the patrol craft *PC-572* in 1947, 67-69

Pugh, Lieutenant Commander Donald E., USN (USNA, 1934)

As a company officer at the Naval Academy in the early 1940s, inspected some of the Bancroft Hall hiding places he had known as a midshipman, 37-38

Racial Issues

In the late 1930s Forbes had his first experience with integrated education, 4-5 In the mid-1960s the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) had a high percentage of black sailors in the crew, 158-160, 165-166

At Norfolk, Virginia, in 1938, 7-8, 11-13

Replenishment at Sea

By the ammunition ship *Shasta* (AE-6) in 1966-67, during the Vietnam War, 161-163, 166-167

Rickover, Rear Admiral Hyman G., USN (USNA, 1922)
